At its formal launching on 12 July 2012, the MLA integrated 20 libraries successfully throughout the Maldivian archipelago. This was made possible with very generous cooperation National Library of Maldives, Educational Development Centre, National Centre for Information Technology and the Nepzilla from Nepal. 

The Act 01/2006 states that a specified amount of copies of all the local publications should be deposited at the National Library for archival purposes. The act also legally makes the NLM as the administrator for maintaining the Maldivian heritage. The purpose of this Act is to archive and maintain the Maldivian heritage for future generations.

The benefits of this Act could be seen in the long run, with the ability to search the local publications via the NLM catalog and via archival of records of the local publications in the national bibliography of the NLM. Additionally, the people who are going to benefit due to this act will no other then the creators, publishers and authors of Maldivian local publications.

This Act was formally implemented in an event organized at the Art Gallery on 21st February 2012.

Library day celebrated national wide during the week of July 12 was marked on the same day at the National University Library of Maldives. Special activities were conducted at the library for the user community. The most significant of these was free giveaways of books.

A special staff event on the occasion was also held in the evening, for the library staff team including student assistants.

The National Library marked its 67th Anniversary along with the nation-wide library day activities.

The event for the day included the launching of the Maldives Digital Library, A joint donation of books by MLA & NLM to the newly built public library in Fuahmulaku, the opening up of a Capital Market Development Authority (CMDA) corner at the NLM, the launching of the MLA book on the Progress of the Library Sector of the Maldives.





Saud Naajih Adam is among the few librarians working in the Maldives with a LIS qualification. Saud holds a BA in Librarianship and Cooperate Information Management from the Curtin University, Australia and joined the Maldives library sector recently in the capacity of Librarian at the National University. In the short period of his professional work, Saud has demonstrated dedication to a profession that is very much stereotyped to be a female dominated one in the Maldives.

Saud envisages the importance of the creating awareness at national level to popularize the image of libraries and librarians being vital organisms in the continuum of information life cycle.

When asked if he always aspired to be a librarian, he says:

"To be honest, like most Maldivians, before I studied in the field of Library Science, I did not even know what librarians do in libraries (apart from a broad generalisation). I cannot say I always envisioned myself in the field of libraries (especially working in an office, considering my previous line of work!)."

He further says that his experience working in the hectic and volatile environment of his earlier workplace, he was ready to undergo studies in a field that would give him a broad understanding in a multitude of disciplines.

definite defining moment as I was already nominated for another scholarship to study ACCA (accounting and finance) in Singapore during that time".

Saud highlights the scholarship opportunity through the Maldives National University in 2007, with gratitude.

In terms of future career development, he aspires to engage in teaching library related programs "I also envision that everyone in at the Maldives National University. He believes the development of the profession lies in educating more people in this field. Accordingly, he incorporated teaching units in his studies at Curtin University. Temote access to knowledge throughout the Maldives.

"I also envision that everyone in Maldives becomes a library user and finally realising the huge asset that has been forgotten. Let me emphasise here that the simple nomads and Bedouins of the Arabian Peninsula became one of

Talking about the challenges, he highlights the difficulty or struggle in embracing library science as a profession given the social stereotyping or social attribution of librarian as a gender specific profession.

"One of the challenges I first encountered was that everyone from Maldives is quite surprised that a guy is working in the field of libraries and studied library sciences as a profession. I had a lot of trouble addressing this stigma associated with guys working in libraries. However the astonishing thing I discovered was that in Australia, in some libraries and were fewer than men. In fact, most of my classmates from University turned out to be guys and they seem quite motivated to be studying library science."

He envisages a challenging time ahead in this chosen career. As he quite rightly highlights, in Maldives there exists a lack of understanding and significance towards information value and usage. "Most people believe that being able to Google, and use Facebook equivalents to being net savvy and proficient information users."

He hopes to make a significant contribution in bringing a positive change to this aspect through his active involvement in imparting information literacy.

He believes the first step in making the Maldives University Library to become a proper information platform enabling remote access to knowledge throughout the Maldives.

Maldives becomes a library user that has been forgotten. Let me emphasise here that the simple nomads and Bedouins of the Arabian Peninsula became one of the beacons for light and guidance not due to their tools and trade or their weapons and fierceness, but due to their great dedication towards learning, assimilating, and dissemination of knowledge i.e. the holy Quran. It is a religious duty of Muslims to gather useful information that benefit us (during this life and the hereafter) and share this knowledge with the rest of mankind."

Saud further adds that the key to success for future library and information services professionals is to have a clear vision of who you are where you are going by choosing to become a librarian. He asks wanna be librarians to ask the following questions and to be guided by the advice.

"Are you doing this because you love the profession? For financial reasons? Due to the ad you saw? Whichever you're reason has made you choose this career, my advice is if you chose to be who you are, and where you are, be sincere towards your choices as the development of this profession depends on your tireless effort and rightful deeds."

MLA Council Members 2012-2013

MLA Annual General Assembly 2012

Annual General meeting for 2012 was held on May 26, 2011. The main agenda items for the meeting include the sharing of the 2011 annual report, finalisation of the activity calendar for 2012, and the election of MLA Council for the new term commencing in 2012. The term of office for the previous Council term came to a close in January 2011.

The meeting was held at the "American Center" at the National Library, from 8:00pm to 9:30pm. A general advertisement for the meeting was placed in Haveeru Daily and the MLA administration called over 50 members on the contact list to inform about the meeting. The meeting was attended by 16 members.

The following is a brief summary from the annual report 2011:

- Basic course certificate awarding ceremony for the course held in September 2010 was held on 19 February 2011.
- The first annual general meeting for the year was held on 19 February 2011 where members for the vacant post of the MLA Council were also held.
- MLA initiated a country-wide library automation project in February 2011.
- The MLA for the first time opened a bank account at a commercial Bank, on 23 August 2011. Earlier the funds were managed through the National Library with an account at the Ministry of Finance. However, this had been dysfunctional for over 4 years owing to various reasons.
- MLA Council member Athiyya Shakeel visited three libraries in H.Dh Atoll to check the status of the libraries and to identify areas of MLA cooperation.
- Workshop on Library Classification held on May 14, 2011.
- MLA organized a "bring a friend" social event for MLA members on 28 July 2011.
- MLA partnered in a country-wide digital library project with the National Library. A memorandum of understanding was signed with the National Library on 22 August 2011. This project was later joined by the Educational Development Centre with also support from the National Centre for Information Technology.
- Training on Koha ILS held from 11-13 September 2011, with 25 participants.
- Training on Greenstone Digital Library software held from 14 to 15 September 2011.
- Consultancy service to the Islamic Library from 18 September to 6 October 2011.
- The MLA newsletter was published as scheduled for April, August, and December.

The activity calendar for 2012 was approved as follows:

- Training on Koha ILS to be held from 3 to 5 June 2012
- Training on Greenstone Digital Library to be held from 6 to 7 June 2012
- Library Day Celebrations, 12 July 2012
- Bring a friend social event, 14 July 2012
- Workshop on publishing guidelines (date to be decided later)
- Workshop on collection evaluation (date to be decided later)
- Next MLA general meeting to be held on 17 December 2012.
- MLA newsletter to be published for the rest of the year – August & December

MLA Council Election

The following changes to the MLA constitution was proposed and approved at the meeting.

- 1) The "Adviser" post for the past two terms (Jan 2007 to Jan 2009 and Feb 2010 to May 2012) was held by the elected adviser Mrs Habeeba Hussain Habeeb (who since inception of MLA held the post of President); during the last term, the post has been treated more like a honorary post by agreement of the rest of the Council members. At the current annual general meeting it was proposed that this post be made a honorary post (without an election) and this be reflected on the constitution. This was proposed mainly to ensure that there would be at least one member common to the outgoing Council and the new Council, in order to ensure the continuity of work.
- a) It was proposed that the current adviser (also a founding member of the Association) be permanently assigned "Adviser" post.

 Mrs Habeeba graciously requested that she be relieved of the post, and offered to provide her assistance as a founding member.
- b) Taking the above into consideration, it was then proposed that the "Adviser" post be assigned as an honorary post to the outgoing President from each term for the new term. This was unanimously agreed by the members present.
- 2) It was also proposed that a transition period be set for the outgoing Council and the new Council to handover tasks for smooth transition. As such, a duration of not less than one month was approved to be assigned as the transition period. Thereby the current Council will continue until the end of June 2012, and the new Council will take Office on 1 July 2012.

The new MLA Council was elected as stipulated in the MLA Constitution, by popular vote by the members present at the meeting.

Maldives Digital Library has been formally

The Maldives Digital Library Project has been formally launched on July 12, 2012.

The "Maldives Digital Library" is an initiative to automate the physical library collections of the Maldives and to make it accessible online as much as possible; it also is an attempt to create digital library collections of local material to provide equitable access to the limited material by the dispersed Maldivian community. The work was initiated by the Maldives Library Association as the MLA Koha Pilot Project in 2011. The project was later taken up by the National Library with support from the Maldives Greenstone support Network, the Education Development Centre, and the National Centre for Information Technology (NCIT).

The Project was launched with 7 Digital Library Collections. Through this project, library automation has been setup at 21 libraries from throughout the Maldives.

Manual on installing Koha - Part 1

Introduction

Koha is the first free and open source software for library automation. It is easy to use, user friendly and has all the modules for automating a library; including acquisition, cataloging, circulation, serials management, and online public access catalog (OPAC). Using Koha, users can also generate reports, generate labels, create patron cards etc.

Today, many libraries have adapted Koha. Even though Koha OSS is free to download and use, many librarians faces difficulty in the installation of Koha. This manual will look in to the two ways to install Koha; installation using the LiveCD, and the manual installation.

Installing Koha - Method 1


Live CD

This method of installation is preferable for the first time users of koha. While this method is easy to install and will allow you to run a small library, this method of installation and usage is recommended for practice only. It is better to do manual installation, explained in Method 2, if you have seriously considered using Koha.

To do the installation, follow the following steps.

- Insert CD to the CPU and restart your computer
- Depending on the setting of your computer, your computer may boot automatically from the CD. Otherwise press F8 to boot from CD
- A new screen will be opened, giving you the following options to choose from
 - a. Live boot the live system
 - b. Xforcevesa boot live in safe graphics mode
 - c. Install start the installer directly
 - d. Textonly book live in textonly mode
 - e. Debug boot the Live system without splash and show bememtest – Run memtest
 - f. Hd boot from first hard disk
- 4. Depending on your needs, choose your options. Since you want to install LiveCD, choose the option c.NOTE: You can also choose option a., from which you can test Koha without the actual installation.
- When you choose option c., setup will start.
 The first step of the installation is to install Ubuntu, the Linux operating system.

6. First you will be asked to choose your language. Choose English, and click Forward



7. The next screen will be "preparing to install ubuntu". Here, the requirements needed to install Koha LiveCD will be shown. Leave the settings as it is by default, and click forward



- In the next step, you will be asked to allocate the drive space. Three options will be given here;
 - a. Install alongside other operating systems
 - b. Erase and use the entire disk
 - Specify partitions manually (advanced) (sometimes, displays as 'Something else')

If you choose, option b., your Windows operating system (or any other operating system which you have previously installed) will be erased along with all your files. It is best to choose this option if you have a new PC, with no configuration and no previously installed operating system.

Option c. is recommended for IT professionals, for those who has the knowledge of partitioning without any problems.

For librarians, who does not have any, or has little IT background, it is best to choose Option a., where you can install Ubuntu alongside your previous operating system.


Therefore choose Option a., and click forward



 As shown on the screenshot below, you will be asked to allocate drive space by dragging the divider. Minimum space needed for Ubuntu is 10 GB. Drag the divider until it shows 10 GB or more, and then click on Install now



 When you click Install Now, a new Pop-up screen will ask you whether you want to write previous changes to disk and continue. Here you can choose continue.




10. While Ubuntu prepares to copy the files, it will ask some questions. The first question will be to choose your location. You can choose your country, and click forward



11. The next question will be to choose the keyboard layout. By default it is USA. Choose your layout and click forward



- 12. Next, you will be asked to fill your details such as
 - a. Your name
 - b. Your computers name
 - c. Pick a username (this will be the username to login to your computer)
 - d. Choose password (this will be the password needed to login to your computer)
 - e. Confirm your password
 You can click on 'Require my password to log in' or 'Log in automatically' based on your needs, and then click forward



 Wait till installation is finished. Click restart and remove the CD while restarting



14. Now, after you login to Ubuntu, it is time to do the web installation of koha

The username and password for koha will be provided in a file called 'readme.r6.txt' in the desktop. In this case, the username is 'kohaadmin' and password is 'kohalivecd'. Type and press Login

20. The first step of the web installer is to specify the language. Choose the language from the dropdown box and click next



- 21. Next Koha will check whether all the dependencies has been installed Click next
- 22. The next step will show the database settings

c. Database type : mysqld. Database name : kohae. Database host : localhost

f. Database port: 3306

g. Database user : kohaadmin Click next

- 23. The next step will check all the settings, click next
- 24. In the next step, the database will be created, click next
- 25. On the next step, it will be shown whether the database creation has been successful or not. Click next
- 26. Now you can do some basic configuration. Click on 'install basic configuration settings' to continue installation

- 15. Next you will be asked to choose the Marc flavours;
 - a. Unimarc
 - b. Marc21

Select option a. or b. depending on your needs and then click Next to continue

16. In the next step, you will be asked to select the default settings. Here some mandatory fields will be imported to your koha database. You can also import optional sample records, such as patrons, patron categories, item types to your library. Depending on your needs, you can choose the optional settings and click Import.

NOTE: If you are using Koha for the first time, it is recommended to import all the optional settings to your library.



17. The next step will ask you to choose the indexing engine. Choose Zebra, if you have a large catalogue, and NoZebra, if your catalogue is not big and click next

Choose indexing engine Searching Koha's bibliographic and authorities databases can be accomplished in two ways. Koha can utilize a textual index engine (Zebra) or use its own internal indexing scheme (NoZebra). You can change your selection after installation and re-index accordingly. Zebra Is highly scalable (can scale to tens of millions of bibliographic records. Now you have successfully installed Koha LiveCD. You will have to login to koha staff interface again to use koha.

Bringing the National Library of Maldives Catalogue online: Liberty5@NLM Liberty



The National Library of Maldives opened its doors on the 2nd of January 2012 at 10:00 am after being temporarily closed for one month from 1st December 2011. The library was closed to complete a stock audit of the library items using the current library management system Liberty5 (from Softlink, Australia) as a pre-task to bring the library catalogue online.

The government's strategic action plan mandates the National Library to provide quality informational services to the general public. Access to an online catalog was a big step taken in this way.

The whole process involved a lot of planning. A liberty committee was setup. Work started early September 2011 when the manual accession register data entry was started to create an e-accession register. This was followed by setting up the English section as the location for stock audit. Tasks for each day were designated. Five groups were selected with four persons each. Each person was targeted to audit 84 items per day.

Public media was alerted about the temporary closing of the National Library, Library users who have borrowed books before this period could return books at the Children's Multimedia Library when the library was closed.

As closing the library for a period of one month is a rare case, the committee decided to maximize and use this time efficiently. As such training programs were incorporated into the auditing so that staff will be refreshed and gain new skills.

The following collections were audited:

- English Fiction
- English Collection
- English National Collection
- Dhivehi Vaahaka (Dhivehi fiction)
- SAARC Documentation Centre Journals
- Statistics Corner
- Islamic Corner
- Past papers
- Staff Reference



In addition all membership data was audited and updated. A total of 30,000 items were audited. The children's multimedia library collection is the next targeted collection for the stock audit.

The stock audit program was a huge success as all the above collections were audited as planned. The next step was bringing the liberty software online. This involved a great input from the National Center of Information Technology team. The National Library applauds the professionalism shown.

When the library was reopened, a new color theme was set up for each collection audited. A facebook group titled "National Library of Maldives" has also been created to get customer feedback for the library in addition to the library hotline 9
