

# Professional Development Workshop for Librarians & LIS students

The study tour to advanced libraries aims to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of the latest trends and innovations in library science. Libraries have evolved beyond traditional book repositories and now serve as dynamic hubs for information access, technological advancements, and community engagement. This tour supplemented with workshop sessions will offer participants the opportunity to explore state-of-the-art libraries that have embraced digital technologies, innovative services, and interactive learning spaces.

### **Objectives**

- •Explore advanced library concepts and emerging trends in the field.
- •Understand the role of libraries in the digital age and their impact on knowledge dissemination.
- •Discover innovative technologies and services implemented in modern libraries.
- •Gain insights into library management practices, including collection development and user engagement strategies.
- •Foster networking opportunities with library professionals, researchers, and fellow participants.







# Faculty of Arts

The Maldives National University (MNU)

Established in 2009, the Faculty of Arts (FA), MNU has been a leader in developing and training human resources in the country in the areas of humanities and selected areas of social sciences. With its short but rich history of academic excellence, the **Faculty of Arts now offers 20 courses**, ranging from Certificate Level III to doctoral degree.

The Faculty commenced the first long-term in-country course in Library and Information Science (LIS) in 2010 as the **Advanced Certificate in Library &**Information Services (ACLIS) course. This was followed by the **Diploma of Library & Information**Services (DLIS) course in 2012.

The MNU Bachelor of Arts (Library & Information Management) (BALIM) course was approved by the Maldives Qualifications Authority in 2021.

BALIM is the first, MQA approved, in-country degree programme in LIS in the Maldives.



### **BALIM**, Faculty of Arts

- The first batch of Bachelor of Arts (Library & Information Management) that commenced with 26 students are scheduled to complete their studies by end of 2023; and the second batch is scheduled to complete by end of 2024. The third batch of the BALIM course is anticipated to commence in February 2024.
- Fifteen students from the first batch and three students from the second batch are joining in this BALIM/MLA professional development program held in Singapore, with aspirations to gain much needed exposure to advanced libraries.
- While the study tour is not an official part of the BALIM course, the Faculty of Arts has actively encouraged the student initiative.

### **MLA**



- The Maldives Library Association was formed in 1987 and has continuously strived to provide professional development for librarians and to uplift and develop libraries in the Maldives.
   With the shortage of library professionals in the Maldives, MLA has faced many challenges in its endeavors and yet continues to be a changemaker.
- This professional development program in Singapore is being held with partial sponsorship by MLA and it is a unique opportunity for local librarians.
- Seven librarians are joining this program in Singapore through affiliation to the MLA.

She holds a PhD in Information Studies from the Nanyang Technological University, Singapore. Her areas of professional interests include trends and technologies impacting academic libraries in the 21st century; roles and competencies of librarians in the 21st century; user needs and user behaviour in academic libraries; and continuing professional education.


